Here is what has been going on in Town:

Special Town Meeting Update

We had a second Special Town meeting on Wednesday, February 28, 2018, approximately forty residents attended, and addressed the three articles on the warrant. The outcome of those articles follows:

- Plunkett Gate Valve Project, financing from Stabilization – Passed Unanimously
- Sewer Infiltration and Inundation Study, Part II – Passed Unanimously
- Funding a search and early hiring of Polly's replacement Collector – Rejected (21/20)

Hinsdale's Hazard Mitigation Plan – The 5 Year Update

As you may know, a group of us are working with Emergency Management Director Ray Bolduc to update our Town's Hazard Mitigation Plan. Hazard Mitigation is just one of several Emergency Management Activities. Mitigation involves sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to life and property from disasters or serious hazards.

The group reviewed the existing plan, and ran through the planning process again, paying close attention to anything that was missing and adding things that are new or that may have changed to our updated plan. We also have done some outreach with our Police, Fire, Water and Sewer departments, as well as outreach to the Planning and Zoning Boards.

the road needs become more apparent. The staff plan to be assessing and repairing things in the coming months.

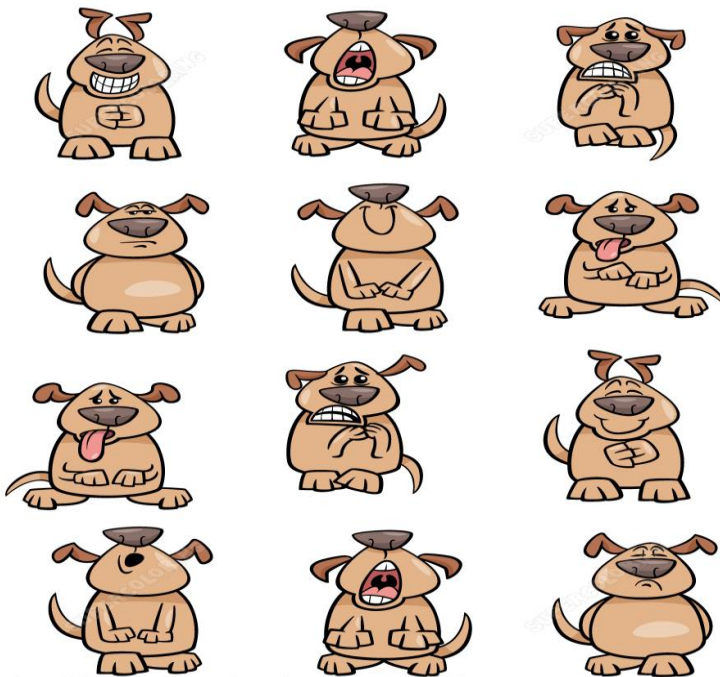
The Plunkett Gate Valve Project

Since the scuba divers verified all the measurements and took video of the existing valve beneath the water, the engineers have placed the order with a delivery date of the replacement, April 4, 2018. The bulk of the work will take approximately two weeks, with set up and clean up on each end. At this time, we expect the project to be complete by May 8, 2018. Based on how they have performed so far, I believe that our contractor Roach and Sons will hit the mark.

Dogs need to be licensed by March 31, 2018. If your dog is not licensed by this deadline, you will be assessed a \$25.00 late registration fee for each dog you own. We'd rather not assess late fees, so please register your dog ASAP. Thanks.

The Fee Schedule is as follows:

- Spayed/neutered, \$10.00
- Not Spayed/Neutered, \$20.00
- Kennel, 2-8 dogs, \$50.00
- Kennel, * or more, \$100.00

The FY 2019 Budget Process

All department heads and committee chairs have submitted their budgets for FY2019, and members of the Select Board and the Finance Committee heard from each of them last Saturday, March 10, to discuss their requests, ask questions, and request follow-up information as we work collectively to formulate next year's budget.

Both the Board and the Finance Committee will continue to work on this through the end of April, so we are prepared to present a cohesive budget to the Town at the Annual Town Meeting on May 16, 2018.

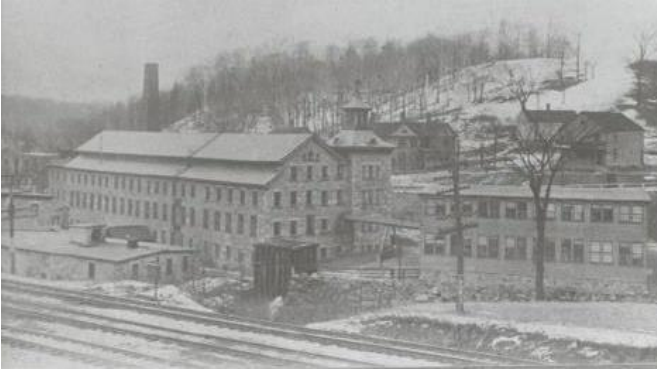
Tree List Update

In March 2017, the Town's consulting Arborist David C. Hawkins provided my predecessor with a Tree Risk Assessment. The assessment report documented 69 potentially hazardous Town Trees that were either severely cracked, dying, or dead, and needed trimming, pruning, or removal. With the help of Jeff's Tree Service, we begin the process of addressing these hazardous trees. Jeff has completed work on 37 of the higher priority trees. He also treated five others that had become problematic in storms between Thanksgiving and New Year's day. Right now, 32 trees remain on our initial list, and with additional funding approval at this May's Annual Town Meeting, we will complete this project on time or ahead of schedule (initially we thought it would take three years, but now could likely be done in two). Kudos to Jeff's Tree Service!
